#### **Dear Association Members:**

We hope you are enjoying this beautiful summer weather we are experiencing! The Board and REI hope you will find the news that follows to be helpful. Thank you for your time in reading the newsletter and for your cooperation where required.



#### **Important Safety Notice:**

On the night of July 23<sup>rd</sup>, a few homeowners reported that their vehicles were broken into and items were stolen. As a reminder, please remove any valuables from your vehicle and ensure it is always locked. Where possible, we also suggest that you "garage" your vehicles. If you note anything suspicious, please contact the police immediately and let us know after the fact.

#### **Upcoming Projects...**

- The following fifteen walls will be replaced in the fall...41-46 Lawrence, 49-54 Lawrence, 63-72 Lawrence, 77-80 Lawrence and 83-86 Lawrence. Once we have received a schedule date from the contractor, a notice will be sent out to those impacted.
- The Landscaping Committee performed a walk through with the landscaping service provider on July 30<sup>th</sup> to review dead plantings/trees that were removed in order to obtain a proposal for replacement bushes/plantings and to review numerous other landscaping issues that need to be addressed. Unfortunately, they were unable to inspect the entire community in one day. They plan to finish the inspection on August 6<sup>th</sup>.
- Please note all plants may not be replaced in 2019 due to budgetary concerns. If your plantings are not replaced this year, they will be put on the list to be replaced next year.



After further consideration, the Board of Directors has agreed to obtain proposals to address power washing/painting of the buildings/decks/mailbox stations/fencing/gazebo/benches throughout the community. The plan is to complete approximately 110 units this year, along with some of the common area structures.

#### **Completed Projects:**

- Numerous dead bushes/plants/trees have been removed. There are still a few dead trees that will be removed within the next two weeks.
- Make The trimming of all bushes has been completed.

# Future Board Meeting Dates

The remaining Board Meetings, scheduled for 2019, will be held on the following Mondays - August 26<sup>th</sup>, September 23<sup>rd</sup>, October 21<sup>st</sup> and November 4<sup>th</sup>. The Open Session for all Board Meetings will begin at **7:00 PM** in the clubhouse. The standard agenda is attached for your review.

A sign-up sheet will be placed outside of the meeting room for your use. The sign-up list will be collected after the Executive Session which will end at approximately 7:00 PM. Only those residents that have signed up will be given the floor to provide the Board with comments during the Owners Forum part of the meeting. Please provide your name, address and topic on the sign-up sheet so that the Board can contact you after the meeting if necessary. Each owner will be given approximately 3-5 minutes to speak. If you feel you need more time, it is suggested that you write to the Board in care of REI.



#### **Pool Reminders**

The pool is open daily from 9:00 AM to 8:30 PM.

A pool attendant is on duty Tuesday through Friday from 2:00 PM to 8:00 PM and Saturdays and Sundays from 12:00 PM to 8:00 PM.

As a reminder, all residents and guests must sign in when the attendant is on duty. Anyone under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult **at all times** while in the pool area. Please note - the attendants are not lifeguards.



All residents must shower before entering the pool.

Only **four guests per unit** are allowed at the pool.

Hoverboards, bicycles, scooters, motorized vehicles, etc. are not allowed within the pool area. Please leave all such items outside the pool gate.

Please close the umbrellas prior to leaving.

Please remember to remove all personal items - towels, toys, sun block lotion, etc. - when leaving the pool area.

Please note the last day the pool will be open is Sunday, September 8, 2019

The remainder of the pool rules are noted on each gate - please review and make note of them. If you observe any rule violations, please complete the rule violation form and forward it to Kelly Montesi at <a href="mailto:kmontesi@rei-pm.net">kmontesi@rei-pm.net</a> or drop it off at the clubhouse.



Please note - the school bus stop for all Danbury and Bethel children is located on Bainbridge Boulevard in front of the tennis court. Parents <u>must</u> park in the clubhouse parking lot – NO on-street parking is allowed.

Any vehicle found to be parked on the street will receive a warning and/or fine hearing letter.



## Timber Oak Ladies Book Club

#### Thursday, September 5th: Red Notice by Bill Browder

New York Times bestseller... "Part John Grisham-like thriller, part business and political memoir." —The New York Times

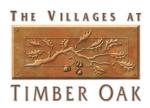
"[Red Notice] does for investing in Russia and the former Soviet Union what Liar's Poker did for our understanding of Salomon Brothers, Wall Street, and the mortgage-backed securities business in the 1980s. Browder's business saga meshes well with the story of corruption and murder in Vladimir Putin's Russia, making Red Notice an early candidate for any list of the year's best books" (Fortune). This is a story about an accidental activist. Bill Browder started out his adult life as the Wall Street maverick whose instincts led him to Russia just after the breakup of the Soviet Union, where he made his fortune. Along the way he exposed corruption, and when he did, he barely escaped with his life. His Russian lawyer Sergei Magnitsky wasn't so lucky: he ended up in jail, where he was tortured to death. That changed Browder forever. He saw the murderous heart of the Putin regime and has spent the last half decade on a campaign to expose it. Because of that, he became Putin's number one enemy, especially after Browder succeeded in having a law passed in the United States—The Magnitsky Act—that punishes a list of Russians implicated in the lawyer's murder. Putin famously retaliated with a law that bans Americans from adopting Russian orphans. A financial caper, a crime thriller, and a political crusade, Red Notice is the story of one man taking on overpowering odds to change the world, and also the story of how, without intending to, he found meaning in his life.

#### Thursday, October 3rd: Becoming by Michelle Obama

An intimate, powerful, and inspiring memoir by the former First Lady of the United States
